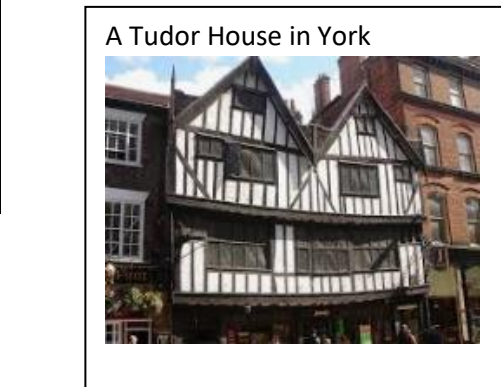

Tudor times lasted from 1485 until 1603. From King Henry VII until the death of Queen Elizabeth I

A significant legacy of the Tudor dynasty was Henry VIII's decision to break with the Catholic Church in Rome. In 1534 the Pope had refused to allow Henry to remarry.
The Renaissance took place across Europe and marked the end of the Middle Ages (sometimes called the Dark Ages).
