This is our reading strategy. We want children to be proficient at reading. Help them to access their online Big Cat book. We want them to be prepared. Help them read their books and answer the VIPERS questions. We want them to be passionate about literature. Help them to unlock the magic of stories by sharing their Bakewell Brilliant Book.

Children will be awarded points for commitment to reading. The easiest way to get this point is for each child to read their Big Cat book online for 30 minutes each week. This should be recorded in their new reading record book. You may also want to record any other reading your child does in this book.
