Maths

Year 4: Last term we completed out numbers to 10,000 unit. We will revisit some of the trickier elements this term. This week we are starting our new unit on addition and subtraction. In this unit pupils will be taught to add and subtract with numbers up to 10 000. They will use the column method for addition and subtraction and they will also learn mental methods for addition and subtraction. Pupils will be encouraged to think about when is the most appropriate time to use each method. They will use the methods taught to solve word problems: visualising the problems using the bar model.

Alongside this the year 4s will also continue their work classifying shapes and begin looking at symmetry. Pupils will explore symmetry and symmetrical figures before applying this knowledge to the completion of symmetrical figures. They will draw lines of symmetry on shapes and figures and will combine this knowledge and understanding to sort a variety of 2-D shapes.

Year 5: Our new unit this term focuses on multiplication and division. The unit begins by finding and defining multiples, factors and common factors. Pupils begin to work with prime numbers and determine what makes a number prime or composite. After this, they work with square and cube numbers before moving on to multiplying by 10, 100 and 1000. When multiplying, pupils are encouraged to use a variety of methods, including number bonds, column methods and the grid method. Number bonds are used to represent multiplicative word problems. Pupils then move on to multiply by 2-digit numbers before beginning to divide

by 10, 100 and 1000 using their knowledge of place value. The unit ends by focusing on division, using a variety of methods, including number bonds and long and short division. Pupils will use calculations which give rise to remainders.

They will use the methods taught to solve word problems: visualising the problems using the bar model.

Multiplication practice is essential in maths and we will be practising our tables throughout the year. We practise every day at school and it would be helpful for children to practise at home as well. Each child has a log in for 'Times Tables Rock Stars'.

English

In English, we will continue to spend time revising and consolidating spelling and grammar knowledge and ensuring that these skills are applied to each piece of written work consistently. Our SPaG lessons this term will cover pronouns, prepositions, commas, adjectives, plural and possessive apostrophes and expanded noun phrases.

Our first unit is based around the book Christophe's Story. The children will work on comprehension and questioning skills, and use inference to focus on characters in the book. They will also look closely at the author's use of language. They will work on creating drama and adventure in their own writing.

We will then move on to looking at an information book –The Shang Dynasty. The focus is on the Big Question: Did the Shang Dynasty really exist? Pupils will retrieve and collate information, explore historical evidence and timelines as well as answer questions and consider what information is true and relevant. They answer the Big Question, planning and writing a non-chronological report.
