Five Pillars The five things that Muslims are of Islam expected to do. Special messengers sent from Allah. **Prophets** Muhammad The last prophet and the key prophet in Islam. Mecca An important place for Muslims. It is where Muhammad was born. Muslims face Mecca to pray. The name of the special pilgrimage Haii Muslims make to Mecca.

The Our'an The holy book of Islam Ramadan A Muslim festival where Muslims fast during daylight and only eat after the sun has set. **Fast** A period of time when Muslims do not eat. Mosque Muslim place of worship.

Muslims believe that there is only one God called Allah. They believe Allah is the only ruler of the universe.

Muhammad is so highly respected by Muslims that they will say "peace be upon him" after his name is spoken.
